August von Kotzebue:

- He is considered to have written the first meloar matic play (*Misanthropy and Repentance*). His plays established melodramates to dominant form of drama in the Victorian Era and 19th Century overall. N MONDAY EVENING NOV
- He wrote his pays for variety of

Rene Charles Guilbert erecourt:

- A French playwright who wrote melodramas for Victorian theatre.
- He is best known for his modern melodrama, The Dog of Montarges.

Oscar Wilde:

- One of the most successful playwrights of late Victorian London.
- The majority of his plays were comedic.
- Wilde's most famous plays include The Importance of Being Earnest and A Woman of No Imporance.
- Wilde went against the Victorian emphasis on instructional and informative qualities in literature and other types of art, and he instead focused on aesthetics.

Douglas Jerrold:

- A playwright whose audience was largely working class.
- One of his most famous plays is Black Eyed Susan, a nautical melodrama featuring a sailor. It is said to be a black comedy.
