## **Conjunctions**

conjunctions are divided into:

- (1) coordinators / coordinating conjunctions &
- (2) **subordinators** / **subordinating** conjunctions.

## **Coordinating conjunctions**

Coordinators connect words, phrases and clauses.

These include "and", "for", "but", "yet", "so" etc.

There are four kinds of coordinating conjunctions.

(1) Cumulative conjunctions or Copulative.

They merely add or connect a statement to another. They include: "also", "both", Notesale.co.l "not only", "but also" etc.

Ex: "The dog got up and walked away slowly"

(2) Alternative conjunctions or disjunctive

Ex: " Neither a borrower nor a lender be".

(3) **Adversative** conjunctions.

These conjunctions express contrast between two statements.

They include: "but", "still", "yet", "whereas", "while", "nevertheless" etc.

Ex: "They are poor but they are happy".

(4) Illative conjunctions

coordinating conjunctions by which a fact or statement is inferred from another.

These include: "therefore", "so", "for" etc.

Ex: "He must be asleep for there is no light in his room".
