Discourse Markers

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- Word/phrase that is relatively syntax-independent & does not change the meaning of the sentence and has a somewhat empty meaning
- Some of the words/phrases are treated as "fillers" or "expletives": words/phrases that have no function at all
- Examples: oh, well, now, then, you know, I mean
- They are important to make your speech/text flow & to avoid a series of shor unconnected statements.

 Can be placed in any part of a sentence
- formal markers for formal writing, such as essays & reports

INFORMAL & SPOKEN DISCOURSE MARKERS

- Discourse markers to <u>order or sequence</u> what we say
- Discourse markers as <u>responses</u>
- Discourse markers showing <u>attitude</u>
- Discourse markers sounding less direct
