Encouraging or assisting

S44 Criminal Attempts act 1981

Intentionally does an act capable of encouraging or assisting an offence by P Intention here refers to direct intent only i.e. It is D's purpose.

S45

Does an act capable of encouraging or assisting believing an offence will be committed by P and believing his own act will encourage or assist

S46

Does an act capable of encouraging or assisting believing one or more offences will be committed and that his act will encourage or assist

S45 & 46

R v Hall 1985 – Belief refers to more than suspicion, but short of knowledge

S65(1)

Invicta Plastics v Clare 1976 – 'encouraging' includes threats or pressures

S49(1) Can commit a crime under s44, 45 and 46 whether a crime is actually committed or not.

Defences

S47(6) – Impossibility if Count defence to incharge office.

acted reasonably in the circu instances that he knew or reasonably believed exists

S51 – Puts the principle from Tyrell 1894 in to statute – if D is the victim of the crime he is encouraging or assisting he is in a protected category.
