

- 8.) **The Intertidal** - they live in intertidal zone and have hard shells to protect them from pounding waves
- they are usually strongly attached/ anchored to the rock
- 9.) **Reefs** - calcium carbonate that are deposited by corals and other animals
- 10.) **Oceanic Zone** - where larger animals such as whales and giant groupers may live
- animals that live here survive by using little energy, moving very little and maintain a slow metabolism, have minimal bone structure
- 11.) **Hydrothermal Vents** - where bacteria that uses chemosynthesis (making of organic compounds) are located
Ex: Shrimp, Giant tube worms, Clams
