 - Scoring Disease Severity.
 - o Evidence Based Treatments.

SUMMARY: Recurrent Ulcers

- Many types of mouth ulcers.
- Recurrence is a major distinguishing clinical feature.
- Aphthous stomatitis is a specific diagnosis not just any 'recurrent oral ulcers'.
- Persistent ulceration is not Aphthous.
- Steroids for RAS.
- Tetracycline for Herpetiform.
