sacred cows: Program of activity considered untouchable or immune to budget pressures

politically uncontrollable spending: Result from policies that make some group automatically eligible for benefits

policy silences: Situation when someone didn't get what they wanted, but they don't do anything about it

Line-item budgeting: offers flexibility in the amount of control established over the use of resources, depending on the level of expenditure detail; presents little useful information to decisionmakers on the functions and activities of organizational units

performance audit: refers to an independent examination of a program function, operation or the management systems and procedures of a geven mental or non-profit entity to assess whether the entity is achieving economy efficiency and effectiveness in the employment of available resources in the employment of available resources financial audit: an independent, objective evaluation of an organization's financial reporting processes

tax-service paradox: situation in which people demand more government services but do not want to pay for them through higher taxes
