## Language of Anatomy = Anatomical Position

The stance in which dobdy is erect, arms at sides with palms facing forward and feet flat facing forward

- Important to allow standard frame of reference to describe position
- Remember, since Subject is facing you, their left is on your right
- Forearm in <u>SUPINE</u> (palms forward, lying face up)
  vs. <u>PRONE</u> position

## **Surface Features of Bone:**

## Projections

- Process: Any bony prominence tesa: shallow depression
- Spine: sharp, pointed process
  Alveolus: socket
- Condyle: row week knuckle like process
  - <u>Epicondyle\*</u>: small bump superior to condyle
- <u>Tuberosity</u>: low, rough process for muscle attachment
- <u>Tubercle</u>: small, knoblike process
- <u>Trochanter</u>: very large process
- <u>Crest:</u> ridge
- <u>Linea (Line)</u>: slightly raised ridge
- Facet: flat surface of articulation
- <u>Head</u>: enlarged end of bone

## **Openings**

Foramen: hole (for nerves & BV)

**Notch**: indentation on edge

- Fissure: Narrow slit
- Meatus: opening to tunnel
- Canal: tunnel
- <u>Sinus</u>: air-filled cavity
