the contents cannot escape at any time. So, the packaging materials must be strong and solid, and resistant to damage by the contents. Replaceable fastening devices must allow repeated refastening without the contents escaping.

The packaging of a chemical that is supplied to the general public must not attract or arouse the curiosity of children or mislead consumers. Packaging must not have a similar presentation or a design used for foodstuff or animal feedstuff or medicinal or cosmetic products.

It is an employer's duty to protect the health, safety and welfare of their employees who might be affected by their business. This is why in our workplace Health and Safety law is located in our canteen area so all employee's are reminded of the Health and safety responsibilities. Risk assessments are carried out that address all risks that may cause harm in our workplace. This includes our band-saw, pillar drill and our copper hydraulic busbar cutting punching bending machine. The risk assessments are easily accessible located on or around the machinery. Also spare PPE is in the area such as goggles. Training is provided by our work foreman before anyone can use the machines by themselves. Only persons that have had training and signed documentation should be allowed to operate the machinery. When assistance is required we consult our foreman or team leader. Health and Safety information is also located on our company intranet.

Every workplace has hazards. In order to manage workplace health and safety and help prevent accidents and sickness absence, it's important to identify, monitor and reduce the risk associated with workplace hazards. Hazards are any aspect of work that cause health and safety risks and have the potential to cause harm to yourself and/or others around you. Some hazards are more likely to be present in some workplaces than others, and depending on the work that you do, there will be hazards that are more or less relevant to your business. Hazards include the work practices and systems used to perform work as well as physical, chemical, biological and psychological agents (for example, workplace bullying, violence and aggression). At our company the main hazards are as follows:

Physical hazards such as cuts, vibration, noise, slips, skin irritation, repetitive movement, manual handling poor body positioning, falling from height, trips and falls. Hazards from heavy machinery like their moving parts and pinch points and hazards while using hand tools. Also Hazard of electrocution in our High Voltage test bay area and battery bays when connection is taking place.

It is our responsibility to act respectful in our working environment and work in a safe manner and not affect the safety and health of others. I have a duty to take care for my own health and safety and that of others who may be affected by my actions. I must co-operate with my managers/supervisors and co-workers. If I have a specific query or concern relating to health and safety, for example if I think inadequate precautions are putting anyone's health and safety at serious risk I need to talk to my manager, work foreman or a health and safety representative. It is my responsibility to follow the training I have received when using tools and equipment. I need to keep my work area clean and tidy to avoid causing hazards such as putting tools and equipment away properly so no sharp edges or blades are sticking out. I need to make sure there are no trailing wires and I keep doorways and exits clear to avoid trips and falls. It is also my responsibility to report any faulty equipment/tools.

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
