Against the criminal laws of the state:

- It must be against an existing law
- It is a form of social control which citizens most conform
- You can't be charged retrospectively

Crimes against morality:

- Reflect our moral beliefs
- Morally wrong

Crimes are harmful to society:

- Some behaviour can be damaging or harmful
- Usually involves a victim
- Can be physical, emotional, psychological or financial

Punishable by the State:

- Investigated by the police
- Charged then taken to court
- Courts determine punishment

Criminal Law:

The BURDEN OF PROOF lies with the PROSECUTION (State, Director of Public Prosecution (D.P.P), the Police...)

Participants in a Crime:
Principal offender - on 2 n two commits the crime
Access in before the ract - helps to 12 n/2 Accessory after the fact - helping the offender after the crime
