- Better marks.
- Extensive attention span.

Some researchers also concluded that children who attend pre-school education programs usually graduate from high school and enroll in universities, have behavioral problems and are not involved in crimes in their adolescence and early adulthood.

Studies showing these benefits have been completed in detail during the 1980s. In addition to benefiting children with normal growth, it has also been shown that children with learning disabilities or other physical disabilities benefit greatly from pre-kindergarten education. Children whose parents interfere with pre-kindergarten education do not receive such harm. Children who learn to speak a second language during their first years of development are in a better position to learn English at an early age.

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
