

2. Asinine (Adjective)

Definition

(adj.) Extremely stupid or foolish.

Example

Bringing a knife to a gunfight? You're **asinine**.

How to memorize - Asinine sounds like "**Acid 9**", so you'll be using that to memorize.

Imagine the number 9 in a classroom at school with arms and legs sitting down at a desk, and his teacher asked it to solve the problem $1+1=?$ and number 9 says, "Easy, it's 25!" and all of number 9's classmates turn around and start calling it stupid, dumb, and foolish. Number 9 hears all of this and gets angry with smoke coming out of its ears and starts throwing bottles of acid at its classmates, chasing them out of the classroom. **(Imagine as silly as possible)**

Whenever you see the word **Asinine** you'll automatically think of "**Acid 9**." Then you'll remember the story that accompanies it, causing you to think of the definition for **Asinine** as **Extremely stupid or foolish**.

20. Pyrrhic (Adjective)

Definition

(adj.) Describes a victory that is won, but at too great a cost.

Example

It was a **pyrrhic** victory indeed.

How to memorize - Pyrrhic sounds like "Parrot," so you will be using that.

Imagine two armies of parrots in war with their weapons as pillows. The battle lasted for hours but ultimately coming to an end with one parrot standing crying, looking at its fallen comrades and screaming "Victory!" (**Imagine silly as possible**)

Whenever you see the word **Pyrrhic**, you'll automatically think of "**Parrot**" Then you'll remember the story that accompanies it, causing you to think of the definition for **Pyrrhic** as **Describes a victory that is won but at too great a cost.**

24. Stoic (Adjective)

Definition

(adj.) Being calm and almost with any emotion.

Example

His features remained **stoic**, but she felt his concern.

How to memorize - Stoic sounds like "Throw it" so you'll be using that.

Imagine you playing baseball with a fictional character, and they tell you to Throw it as fast as you can at them, and as a result, they were unable to catch it, leading the ball to smash their face in, but somehow they were super calm about it and threw the ball back as if nothing happened. (Imagine as silly as possible)

Whenever you see the word **Stoic** you'll automatically think of "**Throw it**" Then you'll remember the story that accompanies it, causing you to think of the definition for **Stoic** as **Being calm and almost with any emotion**.

25. Taciturn (Adjective)

Definition

(adj.) Saying little to less; uncommunicative.

Example

My aunt, being quite **taciturn**, hardly ever speaks her mind.

How to memorize - Taciturn sounds like "Green Lantern," so you will be using that.

Imagine the superhero Green Lantern walking up to a group of other superheroes trying to spark up a conversation but stutter mid-conversation, then got too embarrassed and flew out of the building smashing through the roof. (**Imagine as silly as possible**)

Whenever you see the word **Taciturn** you'll automatically think of "**Green Lantern**" Then you'll remember the story that accompanies it, causing you to think of the definition for **Taciturn** as **Saying little to less; uncommunicative**.
