

THE WHOLE COMPOSITION

Through this lesson the student should able:

CHARACTERISTICS OF A GOOD COMPOSITION

- **Unity**
 - Word theme means a single, definite subject. Unity in the whole theme demands that all its sentences and paragraphs contribute to the development of one idea or one effect and fit into the organic pattern of the whole.
- **Coherence**
 - A whole composition is coherent when there is an unbroken chain of thoughts among the paragraphs and these relationships are clear to the reader.
 - The best way to achieve coherence is to order your thoughts properly. You can arrange your ideas in the chronological order, logical order, point, or view order.
