- **Tuberculosis** a serious disease that mainly affect the lungs.
- **Syphilis** a very serious disease that is spread through sexual intercourse.
- **Parasitic** relating to or being a parasites organisms.
- Schistosomiasis diseased caused by schistosomes.
- ► Schistosomes any genus of (schistoma) of elongated trematoe worms with the sexes separate that parasitize the blood vessels of birds and mammals and cause a destructive human.
- **Pestilence** a disease that causes many people to die. (contagious or infectious epidemic disease that is virulent and devastating).
- Plague a disease that causes death and that spreads quickly to a large number of cople cause by a bacterium (Yersinia pestis)also called as black death.
- Rabies a very serious and often fatal disease that affects and mais (such as dogs) and that can be passed on to people if an infected animal bile (t) exp.
- Anthrax an infectious distance if warm-blooded animals (such as cattle and sheep) caused by spore-forming backshum(Bacillus anthrasis).
- Sencey a disease characterical as severe diarrhoea with passage of mucus and blood and usually caused by infection.
- **Ergotism** a toxic condition produced by eating grain, grain products (such as rye bread), or grasses infected with ergot fungus or by chronic excessive use of an ergot drug.
- **Botulism** an acute food poisoning that caused by botulism toxin produced in food by a bacterial **clostridium (clostridium botulinum)** and is characterized by muscle weakness and paralysis, destructive vision, swallowing, and speech, and a high mortality rate.
- Measles an acute contagious disease that is caused by a morbivillirus(species Measles Virus) and is marked especially by an eruption of distinct red circular spots, also called as rubeola.
- **Typhoid fever** a communicable disease marked especially by fever, diarrhoea, prostration, headache, and intestinal inflammation and caused by a bacterium (Salmonella typhi).
