However, it is up to the college to deem the medical exemption valid or not. The Prinz Law firm states that “Employers must determine if the employee has a qualifying disability under the ADA and if an alternative accommodation can be offered.” If colleges do not see the student’s condition serious enough for them to be exempt even after a doctor's recommendation, they have the option to turn them away. This is an issue because if all colleges decide to require a vaccine, these students will not be able to attend in person. Colleges need to consider these individuals because with a mandate in effect, they will be unable to get an in-person education.
