WAS AUNT LYDIA KIND TO JUNE AND ALL THE OTHER HANDMAIDS?

Aunt Lydia was a cold-hearted lady, unlike most of Gilead's misogynist and totalitarian authority that was made up of Commanders, guards, and Eyes. As in charge, she trained and disciplined handmaids in an infertility-plagued world the Commanders would rape them in monthly ceremonies to conceive a child. Aunty Lydia was also a perfect example of someone who—though stripped of her rights and power as well for being a woman—was desperate for even a slight amount of power and took it in the form of control over the handmaids. And this monstrous lady severed limbs, ordered to pelt stones, and gouged out eyeballs with the great belief she was serving God if handmaids didn't comply. Consequently, Aunt Lydia was not kind to June and all the other handmaids.

Aunt Lydia acted villainously and tortured the handmaids to comply with har der cruelty was portrayed at the Red Center when she trained one of the first groups of (a) drhaids. She didn't hesitate to remove Janine's eye, for example, when she capacar becoming a Handmaid. Also, Aunt Lydia devised many of Gilead's contentions framing techniques, making handmaids to hold rocks for hours in the rain to kill traito's abbind rages.
