First, "environmental harm" (corporations know that their activities are harmful, but they do nothing to stop their growth) second, "questionable sustainability" (people who lead corporations cannot be sure of what they do and why they try to do something) third, "legalized destruction" (there are laws and legal explanations of the actions and services introduced by corporations, and people can do nothing to stop them) Last but not least, "externalities" (the consequences of industrial and commercial activities that may affect a number of people without offering any benefits in return).

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
