

# ENGLISH\_GRAMMAR\_ADVERBS\_OF\_MANNER\_AND\_FREQUENCY\_ ADVERBS\_OF\_DEGREE\_AND\_INTERROGATIVE\_ADVERBS FOR\_HIGHSCHOOL\_AND\_UNIVERSITY\_STUDENTS

**Adverbs of Manner**- Adverbs of manner answer the question “how”

**Examples:**

How are you talking? I am talking **quietly**.

How is she eating? She is eating **noisily**.

How are they dancing? They are dancing **gracefully**.

Most adverbs of manner end in “ly”

But be careful! There are, as usual, irregulars.

That athlete swims **well**. (not “goodly”)

My co-worker types **fast**. (not “fastly”)

**Adverbs of Frequency**- Adverbs of Frequency answer the question “How often?”

**Examples:** I **always** eat dinner with my husband.

We are **usually** on time for our meetings.

She **sometimes** forgets to call me.

Here is a list commonly used in ESL Teaching to help with showing Adverbs of Frequency:

100%= always

80% = almost always/usually
