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★ AHMED SHAH IN CONSOLIDATION OF GUJARAT SULTANATE (ATTACKS)

① ATTACK ON MALWA (1418)

- In 1418 Ahmed Shah decided to take revenge because of Hoshang Shah. Continuously supported rebellious nobles Gujarat against Ahmed Shah.
- He Marched towards Malwa near Ujjain where was broke out which led to the killing of many soldiers.
- Hoshang Shah left battle field and take shelter in Mandu.

Ahmed Shah also marched towards Mandu but due to heavy rain Ahmed Shah back towards Gujarat and entered in A'bad.

- Later on he took on chapaner, he did not get much success (1422-25) but continuously reformed admin structures, ↑ Land Revenue sources / Gave attention to construction of A'bad.



CONDITION OF GUJARAT UNDER CHALUKYANAS

The Chalukyan period is considered to be the golden period when the people of Gujarat were at the height of prosperity. Gujarat achieved this eminent position because of its prowess and progress. The Rule of the family of Mularaja lasted from 942-1214 AD.

MULARAJA

was the founder of Chalukyan dynasty.

He was the son of "Gujaraj" whose father was the ruler of Gujarat in Southern Rajasthan.

Mularaja was the founder of. Mularaja took over the royal power from his maternal uncle Samantakimha of the Chandra Dynasty. He ruled for 55 years from 942 AD. He was the Ambitious King and Saurashtra was the first area he invaded.
