Planning and organization will assist you in actively studying for your courses. When preparing for a test, organize your materials first, and then start active reviewing by topic. On the syllabi, professors frequently include subtopics. Use them to help you organize your materials. For example, make a pile of all the materials for one topic (e.g., PowerPoint notes, text book notes, articles, homework, etc.). Study by topic by labeling each pile with the topic.
