Use cases:

Education: English as a second language (ESL) classes for non-native speakers to improve their proficiency in the language.

International business: Communication with clients or partners from English-speaking countries.

Professional development: Training programs for individuals in various industries, such as finance or technology, where English is necessary.

Migration: Assistance for individuals moving to an English-speaking country and adjusting to a new culture and language.

Examples:

Education: A student from South Korea who values education and personal development may be highly motivated to learn English and attend ESL classes. In contrast, a student from the same country who places less value on language learning may need more motivation.

International business: An employee from a French company traveling to the United States for a business meeting may view improving their English as crucial for their professional development and make a concerted effort to do so, while another employee from the same company may not place as much value on language learning.

Professional development: An employee from a Mexican company attending an English language training program for finance may view the training as necessary for their personal and professional growth and make a solid effort to learn. In

8. Different backgrounds and life experiences: These can impact the type of vocabulary and experiences they bring to the test.

Different backgrounds and life experiences: A person's background and life experiences can also impact their performance on the TOEFL test. For example, those with more diverse backgrounds and experiences may bring a broader vocabulary and experiences to the test, affecting their performance in speaking and writing. On the other hand, those with limited backgrounds and experiences may need help with certain test sections.

Use cases:

College admission: TOEFL or IELTS exams to demonstrate English language proficiency for non-native English-speaking students applying to colleges and universities in English-speaking countries.

Work visas: English language proficiency exams for individuals seeking to immigrate to English-speaking countries for work.

International business: English language proficiency exams for individuals in international business to enhance their communication skills.

Examples:

College admission: A student with a diverse background and life experiences may bring a wide range of vocabulary and experiences to the TOEFL exam, which may benefit their performance in the speaking and writing sections, while a student with little background and experience may struggle with some regions of the test.

Work visas: Individuals with diverse backgrounds and life experiences may perform better on the English language proficiency exam, showcasing a more comprehensive range of vocabulary and communication skills. In contrast, individuals with limited background and experience may need help with certain exam sections.
