Naval talks about the challenges of being famous and how it can be a problem, such as people wanting to take pictures of you even when you are in the middle of something important. Happiness is a choice and it is unpopular to say because it creates a responsibility on people. People take pleasure in being miserable and the pursuit of excellence and success supersedes all other pursuits. Desire is a contract that people make with themselves to be unhappy
