If you open the command prompt in Windows 10, you will typically see the administrator prompt. If you right-click on the command prompt and select "run as administrator," it will have additional privileges to run and execute files.

Changing Directories

To change your current directory, you can use the `cd` command followed by the specific folder name. For example, if you want to go to the "admin" folder, you would type "`cd admin`" and press enter. To go back to the parent directory, type "`cd backslash`" and press enter.

If you want to see the contents of a directory, use the "`dir`" command. To create a new folder, use the "`mkdir`" command followed by the folder name. To rename a folder, use the "`rename`" command followed by the old and new folder names. To create a new file, use the "`type null >`" command followed by the file name and extension.
