
benzoin). He called it as benzin.[20] In 1836, Auguste Laurent named the substance "phène"; [21] this word later served as the origin of the English word "phenol" and the "phenyl", radical which was created by removing the hydrogen atom from benzene.



Charles Blachford Mansfield separated benzene from coal tar [22] in 1845 while writing for August Wilhelm von Hofmann. Four years later, using the coal-tal method mansfield started the first industrial-scale benzene production. Chemists gradually of the conclusion that benzene was a chemically linked compound to a laby of other compounds, forming a chemical family. In 1855, Hofmann gove his family relationship the name "aromatic" in honour of a trait shared by many offits mentbers.[25] In 199 , benzene was detected in deep space.[26]
