- Focus. You will be in the position to help the people who need you the most. Non- Example -Donald Trump (He promises to make America better but avoids addressing this idea to his audience).
- Honesty. The people will be able to trust you so you will get their vote. Non-Example- Richard Nixon ("The Water Scandal" a plot to steal private documents ...)
- Respect. You have to be looking to help others in order to have a great nation of amazing people. Great Example- Theodore Roosevelt.

Point 3 – The importance of the voting process.

- To support the candidate you want to be in the office making decisions for you. (They will be able to fulfill their promises they made in their presidential debates).
- You have opinions in certain issues that are relevant in our world currently. (That inaidate may red your help to express certain ideas or pewon an issues threagotic use of ballots or polls).
- If you don't vote you can't complain about what happens next...

 If the candidate makes a decision or creates a new law you have to abide by and you don't necessarily agree with their concepts you can't defend yourself against their rule because they're in power. So basically you just have to deal with it until the next election.
