

Adjectives Describe: Adjectives provide details about the noun they modify, often describing their size, shape, age, color, origin, or material.

Adverbs Describe Actions: Adverbs describe how, where, or when an action happens, or they can modify the adjective or another adverb.

Prepositions Indicate Relationships: Prepositions show the relationship between a noun or pronoun and other words in the sentence. They indicate position, direction, time, and other relations.

Conjunctions Connect Thoughts: Conjunctions join words, phrases, clauses, or sentences together to create coherent and meaningful sentences.

Interjections Express Emotion: Interjections are short, emotive words or phrases that express sudden emotion, such as surprise, happiness, or anger.

Nouns Name People, Places, and Things: Nouns represent people, places, things, ideas, or feelings and are the building blocks of sentences.

Pronouns Replace Nouns: Pronouns take the place of nouns to avoid repetition and maintain clarity in sentences.
