• These interjections also show how the Caribbean figures are explored in greater detail, often with **metaphors of vision and light** to suggest their ability to guide and influence other people. In contrast, the British figures - such as "Lord Nelson" and "Florence Nightingale" - are only briefly mentioned. This highlights the speaker's admiration of the figures of black history.
