Nursing practice is guided by the nursing precess, a scientific method that provides a framework for individual interpolation. The precess consists of five steps:

- 1. **Assessment**: Collecting data about the patient's health status
- 2. **Diagnosis**: Identifying actual or potential health problems
- 3. **Planning**: Setting goals and determining nursing interventions
- 4. Implementation: Carrying out the plan of care
- 5. **Evaluation**: Determining if the patient's goals have been met

Nurses practice in a variety of settings, including hospitals, long-term care facilities, outpatient clinics, schools, and home health. They work with patients across the lifespan, from premature infants to the elderly. Specialty areas of nursing include critical care, emergency, pediatrics, geriatrics, oncology, and mental health, among others.
