Accident/Error/Injury Prevention. Antibiotics Affecting the Bacterial Cell Wall: Priority
Finding After a Penicillin Injection

(Ch. 44) - ANSobserve for allergic reaction for 30 minutes
dyspnea, rash, itching, hives

Adverse Effects on Phenytoin - ANSProblems with walking and coordination, slurred
speech, confusion, dizziness, trouble sleeping, nervousness, tremor, headache,
nausea, vomiting, constipation, and rash.

- Phenytoin is an oral drug that's used to treat certain types of seizures.
- Phenytoin can cause serious rashes that may require you to be hospitalized. These
rashes may even be fatal.

Adverse Effects, Interactions, and Contraindications: Using an Epinephrine Auto-
Injector

(RN QSEN - Patient-centered Care, Active Learning Template - Medication, RM Pharm
RN 7.0 Chp 5) - ANSfor anaphylactic shock

tachycardia
arrhythmias (v. fib)

can inject through clothes if necessary

Adverse Effects/Contraindications/Side Effects/Interactions - Medications Affecting
Coagulation: Adverse Effects of Clopidogrel

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Antibiotics Affecting the Bacterial Cell Wall: Adverse Reactions

(RN QSEN - Safety , Active Learning Template - Medication, RM Pharm RN 7.0 Chp 44) - ANSpenicillin - anaphylaxis, renal impairment, hyperkalemia, dysrhythmias, hypernatremia

cephalosporins - anaphylaxis, bleeding, renal issues, pain @ injections, pseudomembranous colitis (look for diarrhea)

carbapenema - hypersensitivity, GI upset

Antibiotics Affecting the Bacterial Cell Wall: Allergic Reactions to Cephalosporins

(Active Learning Template - Medication, RM Pharm RN 7.0 Chp 44) - ANS(all drugs start with a C)

rash, dyspnea, hypotension - stop ASAP

if allergic to penicillin might be allergic to this.

Bipolar Disorders: Priority Findings for a Client on Long-Term Lithium Therapy

(Active Learning Template - Medication, RM Pharm RN 7.0 Chp 9) - ANSlithium toxicity (range different for everyone)
diarrhea, nausea, vomiting, muscle weakness, tremor, lethargic, confusion, ataxia, seizures, hypotension, death, coma.

Bone Disorders: Instructions for Taking Bisphosphonates

(RN QSEN - Safety , Active Learning Template - Medication, RM Pharm RN 7.0 Chp 34)
- ANSALENDRONATE
CLIENTS SHOULD HAVE BONE DENSITY SCAN 12-18 MONTHS
CALCIUM LEVELS 9-10.5

take med first thing in AM
empty stomach, then drink 8oz glass of water with tablet or 2oz with liquid form
no calcium for 30 mins
don't lie down after taking
don't double a skipped dose

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
