Responses are credited 3.203 for how well the exponse addresses the question, for candidates selecting relevant examples from the set texts they have studied and drawing a expressing conclusions based on the selected examples in relation to the question posed. Candidates will be assessed on the quality of the conclusions and points they argue and the range and quality of the examples they have selected.

For example, in relation to the question 'how far do the lovers deserve our sympathy?' saying that Narcissus' cruelly rejecting Echo makes him unsympathetic would be evidence of AO3; his saying that he 'would rather die than have anything to do with her' would be evidence of AO2.
