PRESENTATION

- Symptoms
- pain localizing to medial or lateral side
- mechanical symptoms (locking and clicking), especially with squatting
- delayed or intermittent swelling
- Physical exam
- joint line tenderness is the most sensitive physical examination finding
- effusion
- provocative tests
- Apley compression
- Thessaly test
- McMurray's test

IMAGING

MRI is most sensitive diagnostic test the sorbas a high false positive rate

findings

- MRI grade III signal is indicati e o a tear
- parameniscal cyst inflictes the presence of a mer scal tear
- bucket but the mediscal tears indicated by double PCL" sign
 - o "double anterior horn" sign
- meniscal extrusion or "ghost sign," may indicate meniscal root tear

TREATMENT

Nonoperative

- o rest, NSAIDS, rehabilitation
 - indications
 - indicated as first line treatment for degenerative tears

outcomes

• improvement in knee function following physical therapy
