A nurse is admitting a client from a long term care facility. The nurse should use closed ended questions when assessing which of the following factors? - *CORRECT ANSWERS* -When asking if the client took his medications this morning

A nurse is discharging a client who came to the outpatient clinic with an ankle sprain. Which of the following statements should the nurse identify as an indication that the client understands the discharge instructions? - *CORRECT ANSWERS* -I'll apply ice to my ankle today and tomorrow
