Egalitarianism Definition:

Egalitarianism is a trend of thought in political philosophy. An egalitarian favors equality of some sort: People should get the same, or be treated the same, or be treated as equals, in some respect. The French word, egalitarianism (deriving from the word equal) can be best described as the belief in the equality of all men

ORIGINS OF EGALITARIANISM:

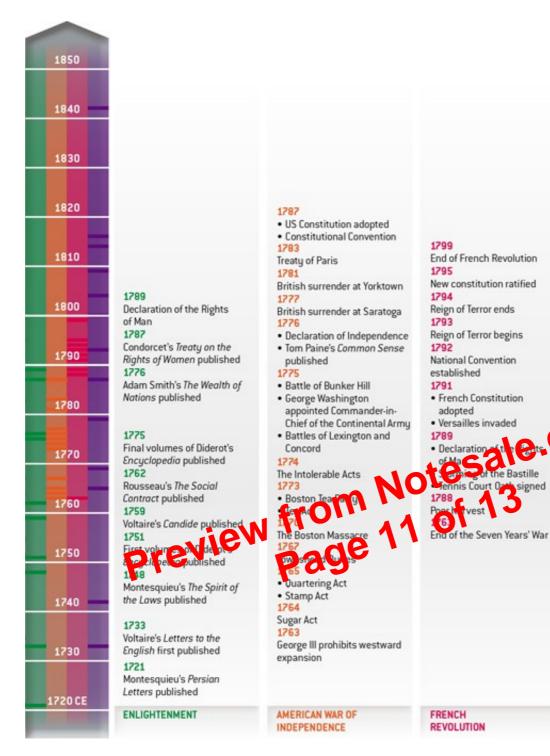
- -Egalitarianism originated with the beginning of the enlightenment. The Age of Enlightenment was an era from the 1620s to the 1780s in which cultural and intellectual forces in Western Europe emphasized reason, analysis, and individualism rather than the traditional lines of rights and authority.
- -The Enlightenment was a powerful force in the movement for equal rights. Its writers questioned the established order, including the distribution of power. This meant examining how states were governed and how decisions were made, and the individual's part in that process.

Many Europeans were ruled by autocratic monarchs who racin ferited the throne and ruled by 'divine right'. Most decisions were in or by the monarch, sometimes with advice from a select few. Peasants comprise of the largest section of the population; some of them were serfs, actually owned by their masters

The Social Control of Nean-Jacques Rosseal, begins with the statement, 'Man is born free in the symmetry where he is it to all some maintained that 'no man has natural authority over his ellow'.

THOMAS JEFFERSEN AND EGALITARIANISM:

- Thomas Jeffersen promoted the idea of egalitarianism, by writing the declaration of independence, which asked for equality amongst all men.
- The Americans formed strong opinions on rights and freedom during their time under British rule and these opinions were written in Thomas Jefferson's "Declaration of Independence". Thomas Jefferson was an American founding father and also the author of the Declaration of Independence. Jefferson was described as "a father figure for the whole country" and Jefferson's hopes and beliefs were famously documented in The Declaration of Independence, which was signed on the 4th of July 1776. "The Declaration of Independence" was based on John Locke's ideas of human nature. This declaration touches on strong ideas of egalitarianism through the way Jefferson rebels against British government and establishes new ideas about the natural rights of life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness. The "Declaration of Independence", was a classic example of the role of egalitarianism as it showed that the American's had a strong belief in the statement, "every man should be considered equal".
