Psychological disorder:

Background;

- Things to have thought to have caused psychological disorders, physical illness, especially fever; astrological influences; a sinful lack of faith in God’s mercy, resulting in despair; difficulties in love, and demonic possession.
- Defined as a clinically significant behavioural or psychological syndrome or pattern that occurs in an individual and that is associated with present distress or disability.
