

1. List three advantages of progress monitoring over annual achievement tests.
 - Progress monitoring will show the student and teacher how much is being learned along the way.
 - Progress monitoring will show where the student may need help in the lesson.
 - Progress monitoring can show weaknesses and help better prepare for the annual achievement test.
2. List two key differences between mastery measurement and CBM.
 - MM masters one task at a time and then moves onto the next one.
 - CBM tests all skills in each test over the year.
3. Name three ways CBM can be used to help at-risk students.
 - Track students' progress by testing them and by examining their graphs and comparing their scores to their expected performance
 - Change teaching and testing strategies if student performance does not increase.
 - Quickly and easily determine which students are unlikely to do well on the year-end assessment
4. What are the six steps in the CBM process?
 - Step 1: Create or select appropriate tests
 - Step 2: Administer and score probes
 - Step 3: Graph the scores
 - Step 4: Set goals
 - Step 5: Make instructional decisions based on CBM data
 - Step 6: Communicate progress
